Upon its public launch in Fall 2009, the LA History Archive will be a web based resource with:

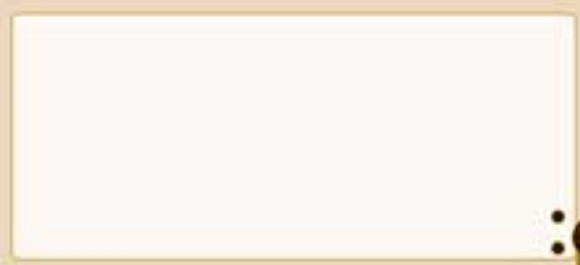
- A Forum on upcoming events & discussions related to history;
